

# Cookie Policy

## FPSB IRELAND COOKIE POLICY

Effective: 1<sup>st</sup> February 2022

FPSB Ireland uses cookies on [www.fpsb.ie](http://www.fpsb.ie). This cookies policy explains what cookies are and how we use them. You should read this policy so you can understand what type of cookies we use, the information we collect using cookies and how that information is used.

### What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that can be used by websites to make a user's experience more efficient.

The law states that we can store cookies on your device if they are strictly necessary for the operation of this site. For all other types of cookies we need your permissions. This site uses different types of cookies. Some cookies are placed by third party services that appear on our pages. You can at any time change or withdraw your consent from the Cookie Declaration on our website.

Cookies do not typically contain any information that personally identifies a user, but personal information that we store about you may be linked to the information stored in and obtained from Cookies. ### What cookies are used on this site?

Cookies can be "Persistent" or "Session" Cookies. Persistent Cookies remain on your personal computer or mobile device when you go offline, while Session Cookies are deleted as soon as you close your web browser.

FPSB Ireland's website uses both session and persistent cookies for the following purposes:

#### Necessary / Essential Cookies

Type: Session Cookies

Administered by: FPSB Ireland DAC

Purpose: These Cookies are essential to provide you with services available through the website and to enable you to use some of its features. They help to authenticate users and prevent fraudulent use of user accounts. Without these cookies, the services that you have asked for cannot be provided, and we only use these cookies to provide you with those services.

## Policy / Notice Acceptance Cookies

Type: Persistent Cookies

Administered by: FPSB Ireland DAC

Purpose: These cookies identify if users have accepted the use of cookies on the website.

moove_gdpr_popup	This cookie name is associated with Moove 'GDPR Cookie Compliance plugin'. These Cookies are used to save your Cookie Setting Preferences.	session

## Functionality Cookies

Type: Persistent Cookies

Administered by: FPSB Ireland DAC

Purpose: These cookies allow us to remember choices you make when you use the website, such as remembering your login details or language preference. The purpose of these cookies is to provide you with a more personal experience and to avoid you having to re-enter your preferences every time you use the website.

## Tracking and Performance Cookies

Type: Persistent Cookies

Administered by: Third-Parties

Purpose: These cookies are used to track information about traffic to the website and how users use the website. The information gathered via these cookies may directly or indirectly identify you as an individual visitor. This is because the information collected is typically linked to a pseudonymous identifier associated with the device you use to access the website. We may also use these cookies to test new pages, features or new functionality of the website to see how our users react to them.

Cookie Name	Description	Expiry
_ga	This cookie name is associated with Google Universal Analytics - which is a significant update to Google's more commonly used analytics service. This cookie is used to distinguish unique users by assigning a randomly generated number as a client identifier. It is included in each page request in a site and used to calculate visitor, session and campaign data for the sites analytics reports. By default it is set to expire after 2 years, although this is customisable by website owners.	2 years
_gid	This cookie name is associated with Google Universal Analytics. This appears to be a new cookie and as of Spring 2017 no information is available from google. It appears to store and update a unique value for each page visited.	1 day
_gat_gtag_UA_nnnnnnnnn_n	This is a pattern type cookie set by Google Analytics, where the pattern element on the name contains the unique identity number of the account or website it relates to. It appears to be a variation of the _gat cookie which is used to limit the amount of data recorded by Google on high traffic volume websites.	A few seconds
